EDF Energy Response to UNC Modification Proposal 241: “Delaying the implementation of the ad-hoc application principle of the enduring offtake arrangements”.

EDF Energy welcomes the opportunity to respond to UNC Modification Proposal 241. We support implementation of 241.

EDF Energy believes that implementation of this proposal will enable NGG sufficient time to develop the associated documents and processes required to support the introduction of an enduring exit regime this year. We believe that delaying the ad hoc application process is a pragmatic solution given that Shippers will continue to have an opportunity to book incremental capacity for 1 October 2012 in the July application window, and the requirement for NGG to have an approved ExCR in place to support these new arrangements.
