# IRR Entries Covered by DME

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- Use of more frequent reads to feature in daily allocation/reconciliation (4.4, 4.5, 4.6)

# IRR Entries not Covered by DME

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- Read/volume capture
  - Quotas/timings (4.1, 4.3) 8 comments
  - Responsibilities (4.2) 2 comments
  - Submission of volume/energy as an alternative (7.1) 2 comments
  - Read replacement (9.2, 9.5) 4 comments
  - Widening or abolition of meter read window (13.9) 1 comment
- SPA matters, including recording of AMR devices, access to data, bulk transfers (1.6/1.11; 1.5/1.10/13.1/13.12/13.4/13.3; 1.3/10.6) 12 comments
- Management of emergency contact details (10.5) 3 comments
- Connections process (3.1, 3.5) 2 comments
- Supplier switching processes and timescales (1.2, 1.4, 3.2) 9 comments
- Isolation processes (8.7) 1 comment

# IRR Entries not Covered by DME cont.

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- Invoicing comments e.g.
  - Review of invoice validation (8.2, 8.11) 2 comments
  - Improved reconciliation filter failure process (8.8) 1 comment
  - Fewer adhoc/off-line charges and invoice (8.1) 3 comments
  - Improved invoice supporting information and access to data (8.6, 8.9, 8.10) 5 comments
  - More flexible invoicing across Shipper portfolios (8.3) 1 comment
  - More flexible pricing module (8.4) 1 comments
  - Easier update of data and automatic billing updates, including review of ownership of data (9.3, 9.4, 11.7, 13.3) 4 comments
- Review of incentives or liabilities (10.3) 1 comment
- Review of reporting requirements (10.4) 1 comment

# IRR Entries not Covered by DME cont.

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- Comments which are transitional
  - Split of daily allocation data by market sector (10.8) 1 comment
  - Review of SOQ process (10.12) 1 comment
  - Review of Winter Annual Ratios and number of EUCs (10.11) 1 comment
- Technology related comments
  - Inclusion of Unique Sites in core solution (10.9) 1 comment

# DME v IRR Analysis - Assumptions

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- Dual fuel requirements in the IRR relate mainly to the SSP/Domestic market, not to business customers
- Data management and non-functional comments will be dealt with when all requirements are known, i.e. after CCP processes are defined

# Prioritisation of AMR Topic Areas

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- Possible approaches to selecting topics for development of detailed requirements
  - Follow a process flow approach
  - Prioritise based on number of IRR comments
  - Focus on areas which relate exclusively to AMR sector, e.g. avoid Invoicing at this stage
  - Prioritisation based on current assessment of issues (rather than IRR comments submitted in 2008/09)
