1.0 Outline of Modification and initial discussion

GE introduced the modification, explaining the intention to remove the financial exposure that Shippers face as a result of customer bill adjustments for settlement errors beyond the invoice cut off line for meter errors.

GE explained any claim must be a valid claim and some validation may need to be undertaken, however he was not expecting Xoserve to challenge disputes. DA explained typically Xoserve systems are designed to provide this element of challenge so this may need further consideration.

AM asked about the effects on the AUG process. It was recognised that the AUGE would need to take into account "fossilised" Unidentified Gas and that the AUG guidelines would need to be amended.

AR asked if the alternative to this modification would be to increase the line in the sand processes to six years.

AM questioned if contracts can be written to address the situation. However, GE believed contractual limitations couldn't be placed upon customers that prevent customers from exercising their rights under the statute of limitations.

It was agreed to consider the modification further at the next meeting.
