The Workgroup Report is due to be presented at the UNC Modification Panel by 15 June 2017.

1.0 Outline of Modification

Introducing the item, BF advised that the modification had been amended prior to the meeting whereupon CB confirmed that this was undertaken in response to DSC Change Management Committee feedback and the changes focus on enabling parties to step down during the year and also sees the inclusion of additional class appointments where previously there was none.

The Workgroup attention focused on the Section 5 – Solution, where CB explained that the thinking behind advocating three calendar months before the start of the next annual election cycle proposal.

BF pointed out that in essence, what the modification is proposing is a nominations process that could/would be followed by a vote mechanism should positions be oversubscribed.

Some concerns were voiced around the potential impacts associated with when a party accedes into position / class and also temporary votes being given to other parties (i.e. relinquishing inherited seats (positions) etc.) – in short, should Class A and B representatives inherit Class C voting rights, in the absence of an actual Class C nominee, they would / should relinquish these in the event that a Class C party steps forward. Thereafter, the new Class C representative would have both votes for Class C.

CB explained that the principle aim behind the modification is to make it easy for representatives to step forward and assume responsibilities of members who choose to retire, move organisation or come forward because their class was previously unrepresented.

In considering the proposed ad hoc election process, BF advised that the bulk of the estimated timeline would already be covered under the SPOC process.

When asked, CW indicated that he hoped that legal text would be provided in time for consideration at the next Workgroup meeting.
