Mid-period review decision. On <u>24 February 2017</u> we published a mid-period review (MPR) decision to reduce National Grid's allowances across gas and electricity by £185 million. Notably, we have decided to remove National Grid Gas Transmission's Avonmouth pipelines output and £168.8 million in funding, as the pipelines are no longer required.
