We agree that implementation would be likely to facilitate relevant objectives d) i) and ii) securing of effective competition between shippers and suppliers. It would also be likely, to a lesser extent, to facilitate relevant objectives a) efficient and economic operation of the pipe-line system and f) promotion of efficiency in the implementation and administration of the code.
