



## COR2789 - Measures to Address Unregistered & Shipperless Sites

MOD424 & MOD410a have been approved by Ofgem to amend the provisions of the uniform Network Code regarding Re-establishment of Supply Meter Points to ensure Supply Point Registration and recovery of relevant charges is achieved.

The primary goal for this delivery is to implement functionality within CMS that would allow the identification, monitoring and invoicing of the MOD424 and MOD410A scenarios and retrospectively invoice for the 'missing' period

The intended implementation date is on the weekend of **21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2014** and current expectation is that the implementation will be carried out within the existing scheduled maintenance windows. Further clarification will be provided at a later date.



Modification 424 seeks to ensure Supply Point Registration and recovery of relevant transportation and energy charges is achieved where gas is consumed at a Supply Point which has been subject to Effective Supply Point Isolation or Isolation and Withdrawal but the original Supply Meter remains connected (or has been reconnected) and is capable of flowing gas.



Modification 410a relates to the responsibility for gas off-taken at Unregistered Sites following new network connections.

This modification places responsibility on the party requesting the Meter Fit to be liable for all energy and transportation charges at an unregistered new supply meter point.

MOD410A introduces provisions to the UNC, which require Users to ensure their Suppliers have valid supply contracts in place before commissioning the installation of a Supply Meter at a New Supply Meter Point.

This will be accompanied by measures to secure that a New Supply Meter Point is either registered to a User or disconnected.

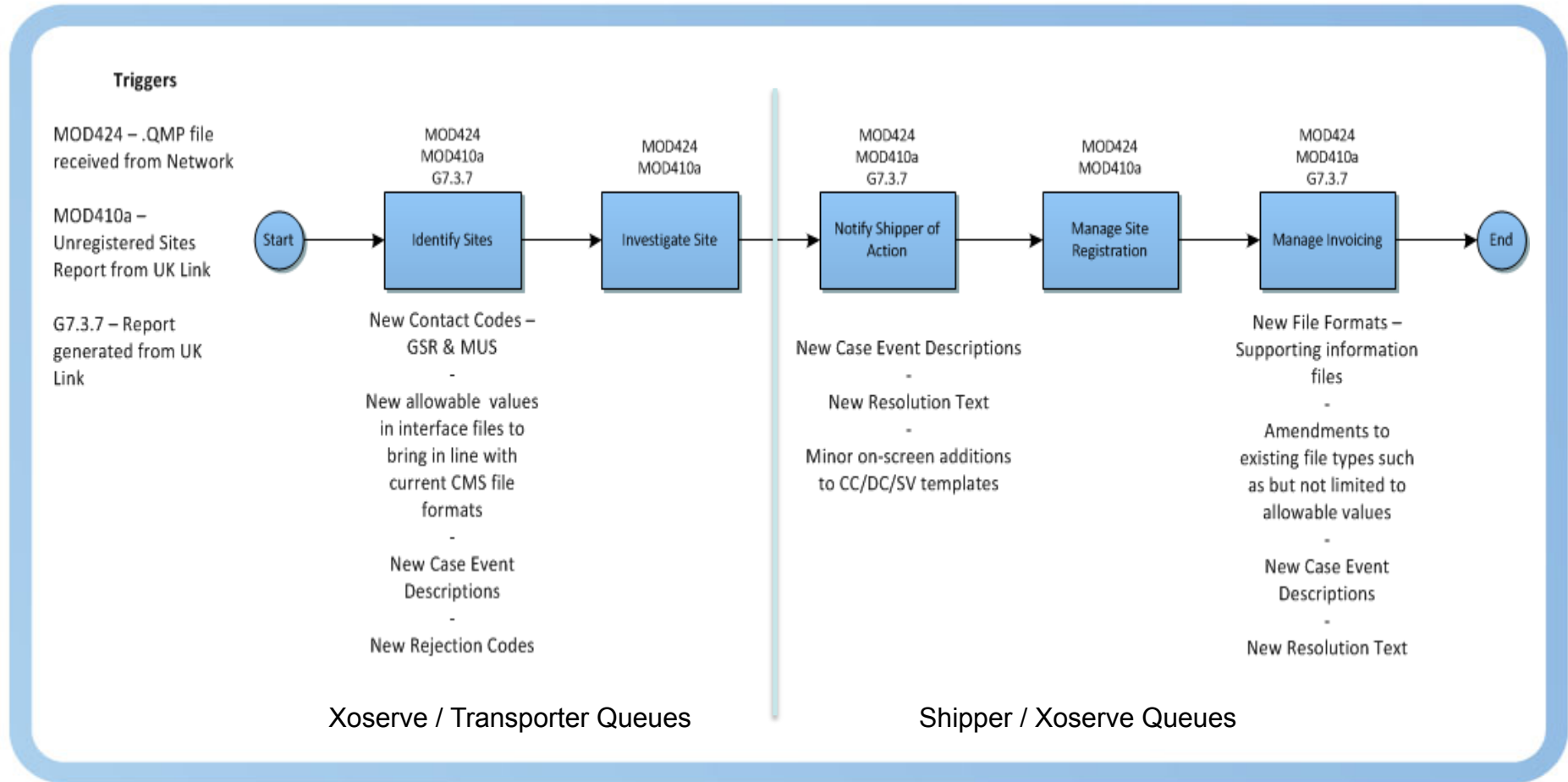


UNC Section G 7.3.7 specifies requirements relating to the registration of New Supply Meter Points where the initial Meter Attach Effective Date is prior to the first confirmation and the requirement to invoice the period between meter fix and Confirmation Effective Date.

These rules and the processes to enable the invoicing of transportation and energy charges are not reflected in Xoserve's central system processes and therefore Change Order COR2983 has been raised to provide functionality to enable invoicing.
