> Modification Proposal 0083 - "Proposal to insert obligations to process data received from iGTs in line with the requirements as outlined within Annex A of the Connected System Exit Point (CSEP) Network Exit Agreement (NExA)."

Total Gas \& Power Limited (TGP) supports modification 0083.

- Though Transporters are currently obliged by the terms of their CSEP Nexa agreements with iGTs to process updates in a timely manner, these obligations are not explicitly within the Code and Shippers have no oversight over these provisions.
- It seems appropriate that these provisions are subject to the UNC governance process as the operation of the Transporter-iGT interface is critical to Shippers in providing a good service to end consumers connected to iGT networks.
- This modification provides that oversight and therefore Modification 0083 promotes the Transporters' ability to operate the network in an efficient and economic manner, fulfilling the relevant objectives of licence condition A11.
- It has been highlighted at the Distribution Workstream that these changes are related to similar proposals to modify the iGT Network Codes. It will be necessary for the iGT Network Code to be modified in order to allow this UNC change to be fully effective.
