Dear Colleague,

Request for urgent status for modification proposal UNC128: 'Amendment to Entry Capacity Baselines'.

Following consideration of the request that modification proposal 128: 'Amendment to Entry Capacity Baselines' follows urgent modification procedures, Ofgem has today agreed to that request.

In reaching our decision on granting urgent status we have considered the details contained within the modification proposal and the Proposer's justification for urgency. Ofgem considers that this proposal satisfies the criteria for granting urgent status to a modification proposal, as set out in its published guidelines¹. In particular, we consider that the proposal is both linked to:

- a real likelihood of significant commercial impact upon GTs, shippers or consumers
 if the proposal is not granted urgency. The impact of not implementing the
 changes in a timely could be an increase in buyback costs. National Grid Gas
 (NGG) would be exposed to fifty percent of the first £36m of any such costs and
 shippers (directly) and consumers (if the costs are passed through) to any costs
 not borne by NGG; and
- an imminent date related event, the date being that of the February Annual Monthly System Entry Capacity ('AMSEC') auctions. These auctions will relate to the sale of capacity from the 1st April 2007. It is anticipated that NGG's capacity release obligations will change on and from the 1st April 2007 as part of the anticipated changes to NGG's licence to give effect to the agreed² proposals for the transmission price control review. These changes are relevant to the February auctions.

Urgency Timetable

Whilst agreeing that this proposal should be given urgent status, we have not agreed to the urgent timetable originally suggested by the proposer.

Ofgem notes that the proposer indicates that it would be "preferable" to notify the AMSEC auctions on 16^{th} January 2006 and so proposes a timetable which delivered the modification on 15^{th} January 2006. However Ofgem notes that the notification of the AMSEC auctions must be issued by 18^{th} January 2006 and therefore considers that it is appropriate to have a timetable that delivers a decision on the proposal on 17^{th} January 2006

Ofgem has therefore determined that this proposal should follow the following timetable:

Modification Panel Decides on Recommendation	08/1/07
Revised Urgent Modification Report Issued to Ofgem	09/1/07
Ofgem decision expected	17/1/07

For the avoidance of doubt, in accepting this request for urgency, Ofgem has made no assessment of the merits of the modification proposal and nothing in this letter in any way fetters the discretion of the Authority in respect of this modification proposal.
