Initial Thoughts

- Implementation of TAR NC by end of May very challenging!
- What is the plan going forward?
- We would like to see analysis referenced in decision letter published?

- No decision:
 - Extends market uncertainty
 - Has commercial consequences
 - May have legal consequences
 - Impacts trading positions
 - Impacts system developments Xoserve and Shipper



Observations

- Mention of Electricity TCR but that only considers residual charges, there are no plans to remove locational charging
- Cost reflectivity is less relevant ? But is a requirement of TAR NC and NG licence
- A jump in charges at implementation is more acceptable at the start than with longer notice after a transition period ?
- Existing contract price protection not clear if fixed capacity price or avoidance of any 'top-up' charge
- Welcome recognition of impact of netting–off of Existing Contracts

- Transfers of existing capacity and fixed price protection
