System Management Principles Statement consent notice 2019

Special Condition 8A.9 of the Gas Transporter Licence requires National Grid Gas plc (NGG) to have in place at all times a System Management Principles Statement (SMPS). The purpose of the SMPS is to set out the principles and criteria by which NGG will determine the USE of System Management Services. On <u>8 May 2019</u> we published our consent for NGG to revise its SMPS following an annual review of the statement.

RIIO-2 Sector Specific Methodology Decision

On <u>24 May 2019</u> we published our RIIO-2 Sector Specific Methodology Decision (The RIIO-2 May Decision). In December 2018, we consulted on proposals to set the sector-specific methodologies for the Electricity Transmission, Gas Transmission, Gas Distribution and the Electricity System Operator RIIO-2 price controls starting on 1 April 2021. This document sets out our decision on the policy areas applying across these sectors, except where otherwise indicated. There is a separate annex setting out Finance decisions. Further information on decisions for each sector are set out in separate annexes to this document. Network companies will use this information to develop their Business Plans over the remainder of 2019.

BBL: Authority Motivated Decision pursuant to Article 27(4) of the EU Network Code on Gas Tariffs

Article 26(1) of the EU network on gas tariffs (TAR) requires IUK to consult on information relating to its reference price methodology. Between 21 February 2019 and 25 March 2019, BBL ran its Article 26 consultation. Article 27(4) of TAR requires Ofgem to take and publish a motivated decision on all items in Article 26(1) as consulted by BBL. Upon reviewing the consultation and the documents referred to by the Article 26 consultation we are satisfied that BBL has fulfilled the requirements of Article 26(1) of TAR. On 3 June 2019 we published our motivated decision for BBL pursuant to Article 27(4) of TAR.

Informal consultation on modifications of National Grid Gas plc's gas transporter licence for treatment of new entry and exit points with zero baseline capacity

On <u>3 June 2019</u> we published an informal consultation on modifications of National Grid Gas plc's gas transporter licence for treatment of new entry and exit points with zero baseline capacity. The purpose of these proposed licence changes is to improve the overall connection process for new sites with zero baseline capacity. We are proposing that all new entry and exit points with zero baseline capacity are added to the entry/exit baseline capacity tables contained in a report called the "Long Term Summary Report" and not added to the licence. We also propose that NGG should be responsible for conducting the consultation required under Article 18(4) of the EU Gas Regulation for all new zero baseline capacity points. NGG shall then send us all of the responses to the consultation. We will continue to approve the classification of all new entry and exit points under Article 18(4).
