1 Summary

What

The reference to the Data Protection Act needs to be updated.

Why

For all intents and purposes, the Data Protection Act 1998 Act is repealed and replaced by 2018 Act. The provisions in the 2018 Act that repeal most of the 1998 Act are <u>s.211 (1) (a)</u> and <u>para 44</u> of Sched. 19 of the Data Protection Act 2018. S.211 (1) (a) provides:

"In Schedule 19-

(a) Part 1 contains minor and consequential amendments of primary legislation ..."

Para 44 of Sched, 19 adds:

"The Data Protection Act 1998 is repealed, with the exception of section 62 and paragraphs 13, 15, 16, 18 and 19 of Schedule 15 (which amend other enactments)."

Therefore, for the purposes of the UNC the Data Protection Act 2018 repealed the Data Protection Act 1998 and this needs to be reflected in the UNC TPD V 5.3.4.

How

By an amendment to the legal text of TPD V 5.3.4

Further comments

There are some sections of TPD V that probably should be reviewed in the light of the introduction of GDPR as the provisions on the release of data could be too wide. The sections are, 5.15.1 and 5.18.1, in each case there may be that there is the risk of the CDSP providing personal data without permission although it may be that one of the statutory exemptions applies. This needs to be tested if it has not already been done. Notwithstaniding that compliance with GDPR overrides provisions of Code and therefore data that Code allows to be released may be withheld to avoid breaking UK Law, Code should be revised if required to remove any



potential for misunderstanding. 5.11.1 looks at first sight as though it falls into the same category as the other clauses but the information supplied in Annex V-5 does not appear to include personal information.

Agreements authorised by the UNC such as confidentiality agreements, third party services agreements (5.18.2) and the Data Services Contract should be review for GDPR compliance if they have not already been reviewed.
