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

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1 Summary

Is this a Self-Governance Modification?

This modification should be classed as fast track self-governance because it is a housekeeping modification to remove time-expired UNC provisions.

Why Change?

Over time, Section TDIV – Modification Rules contained within the Uniform Network Code Transitional Document has become time expired. These rules have now become redundant but retaining them within the UNC may give the impression that they remain current obligations.

Solution

Removal of time expired Section TDIV – Modification Rules contained within the UNC Transitional Document.

Relevant Objectives

Implementation would promote efficiency in the implementation and administration of the Code.

No costs would be incurred as a result of implementation of this modification.

Implementation

No timescale for implementation is proposed. However, if accepted as a fast track self-governance modification, this could be implemented 16 business days after being considered by the Panel (subject to no objection being raised).

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2 Why Change?

Section TDIV – Modification Rules was originally created within the UNC Transition Document to facilitate the administration and management of UNC Modification Proposals raised prior to the Code Governance Review Implementation date of 31 December 2010, and have therefore become time expired and redundant. This creates the possibility of resources being wasted when parties seek to understand the obligations that exist under the terms of the UNC.

3 Solution

It is proposed to completely remove Section TDIV – Modification Rules from within the Transitional Document.

User Pays
