# 1 Summary

### Is this a Self-Governance Modification?

The Modification Panel determined that this is a self-governance modification because it is unlikely to have material effect on gas consumers; competition, the operation of pipe-line systems, safety or security of supply, the uniform network code governance procedures or the network code modification procedures.

### Is this a Fast Track Self-Governance Modification?

The Modification Panel determined that this modification should be classed as fast track self-governance because the identified changes are considered to be of a minor housekeeping nature, having no material effect on consumers or competition between Shippers and Suppliers, as they do not change any of the rights or obligations of Code parties.

## Why Change?

The updating of UNC with Modification 0432 legal text, as written, would result in sections of Code being unclear because of a number of minor numbering, formatting and consistency related conflicts. In general these have arisen due to the consequential effects of delay in implementation of Project Nexus.

#### Solution

This modification seeks to resolve identified conflicts within Project Nexus related Legal Text (pertaining to Modification 0432) which are highlighted in the Project Nexus Legal Text Tracker. A separate document (Output from PN LT Tracker) has been published alongside this document that provides instructions on correcting any conflicts which exist in the Legal Text for Modification 0432. Whilst not part of the Solution, once this Modification is implemented, Transporters will identify 1<sup>st</sup> July 2016 as 'lockdown' reference date. All modifications which require Legal Text between this date and the Project Nexus Implementation Date (PNID) will be assessed by Transporters to identify whether two sets of Legal Text, transitional and enduring are required.

### **Relevant Objectives**

This modification furthers Relevant Objective (f) Promotion of efficiency in the implementation and administration of the Code because it ensures correct numbering, formatting and consistency in the legal text pertaining to the Transportation Principal Document.

### **Implementation**

As fast track self-governance procedures are proposed, implementation could be sixteen business days after a unanimous vote in favour of implementation by the Modification Panel, subject to no objection being raised.

Does this modification impact a Significant Code Review (SCR) or other significant industry change projects, if so, how?

Neither the Switching SCR nor implementation of Project Nexus is impacted.

## 2 Why Change?

This modification seeks to address legal text numbering, formatting and consistency conflicts that would arise at the point UNC modification 0432 (Project Nexus – Gas Demand Estimation, Allocation, Settlement and Reconciliation reform), is implemented and becomes effective on the Project Nexus Implementation Date (PNID). Without correction by this modification, the Legal Text would be unclear and liable to cause confusion.

Largely due to implementation of subsequent UNC modifications, it is not possible for the UNC to be updated with the Project Nexus Legal Text as written.

In February 2016, the Joint Office concluded an exercise to determine the impact in relation to the UNC (the Project Nexus Legal Text Tracking Exercise). This resulted in a number of potential Code references being highlighted as being in conflict preventing inclusion in UNC.

National Grid Gas Distribution, working closely with the Joint Office, identified and investigated all relevant conflicts and produced a schedule of required changes to legal text and numbering which can be seen in the document Output from PN LT Tracker. Clear updating instructions have been provided.

## 3 Solution

The separate Output from PN LT Tracker details the required numbering, text and formatting changes required.

Whilst not part of this Modification Proposal, a 'lock down' date of 1<sup>st</sup> July 2016 has been identified. This is a process step for Transporters as the providers of legal text and is described below:

#### **Lock Down Date**

In the event that modifications are proposed to be implemented in the period between the proposed lock down date of 1<sup>st</sup> July 2016 and PNID (presently 1<sup>st</sup> October 2016), then where necessary Transporters would produce 2 (two) sets of legal text (Transitional and Enduring). This will show the impact on the live Code and the impact on the 'to be' Code after PNID.

Where modifications are directed for implementation with an implementation effective date prior to PNID then the UNC would be updated with the transitional and enduring text (should this be relevant).

Where modifications are directed for implementation with an implementation date post PNID then UNC would be updated with the enduring text only.

- 1<sup>st</sup> July 2016 to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2016 Transitional text in Code
- 1<sup>st</sup> October 2016 onwards Enduring text in Code

Note: In respect of bullet 2 this excludes any transitional text which may be required as part of the Modification solution.
