

0574: Creating the permission to release supply point data to the Theft Risk Assessment Service (TRAS)

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Why change?

- In January 2013 Ofgem implemented new licence conditions for gas suppliers to detect, prevent and investigate theft, including a requirement for a central service to assess the risk of theft of gas at consumer premises and so help target theft investigations. To meet this condition a single energy Theft Risk Assessment Service (TRAS) is now being put in place, which will go live in April.
- The TRAS has a requirement to access Supply Point Information, arising from terms agreed with SPAA for the purposes of assessing energy theft risk.
- The necessary permissions under the UNC to facilitate this provision of data need to be created.

Why Change?

- The benefit of increased theft detection is decreased cost for consumers and industry parties, as theft volume is accounted for within industry unallocated energy processes.
- Identification and prevention of theft will reduce unallocated gas and will therefore lead to a improved settlement allocation accuracy for all parties under the UNC.
- Additionally and significantly, reducing the number of theft instances within the industry will reduce the overall safety risk to consumers.

Solution

 This enabling modification is proposing to grant access and permissions to access relevant Supply Point Information to the TRAS provider.

Recommended Steps

•Npower recommends that this modification should be:

- Subject to self-governance
- Referred to a Workgroup for assessment to develop the modification, and that one month is needed for that development.
