1. Introduction

BF welcomed all to the meeting.

2. Outline of Modification

CH introduced the modification. The intention is to create choice instead of the present lower-of rule - Transporters set a User's Unsecured Credit Limit no higher than the lower of the credit value recommended within a User's Independent Assessment and the value calculated by applying the Independent Assessment Score to the Transporter's Maximum Unsecured Credit Limit.

3. Consider Terms of Reference

No further comments were received on the Terms of Reference.

4. Initial Discussion

CH noted the initial representation provided by WWU. The analysis for the WWU network suggested that the impact from the modification produced larger unsecured

credit values than CH had anticipated. In light of this, CH would welcome working with the DNs to amend the modification in order to reach a mutually acceptable way forward.

JF felt personnel actively working on credit management should be involved in the assessment process, and suggested discussions involving those with the requisite knowledge, as opposed to a general Workgroup, would be fruitful. BF agreed to arrange a separate meeting on the basis that credit managers would be involved, from both Shippers and Transporters.

CH confirmed that, notwithstanding his initial aspiration to achieve implementation by 1 July 2011, he would now prefer the modification to be fully developed and an appropriate solution identified.
