The Workgroup considered the Workgroup Report. A number of elements within the Final Modification Report for Modification 0369 - Re-establishment of Supply Meter Points – measures to address shipperless sites were reiterated within the Workgroup Report within the relevant objectives relating to customers reconnecting their own meter.

JD asked about the retrospectively of the modification. CW clarified that the modification was not in any way retrospective and would not address any backlog of sites. However it was expected to proactively reduce the number of shipperless sites going forward by reducing the number of new shipperless sites.

It was recognised that the Gas Safety Regulations may not be the only route that sites can be identified. It was acknowledged identification might be discovered through an emergency visit.

AJa asked what would happen if the supplier has ceased to exist. Participants were unsure but felt similar provisions to supplier of last resort would apply.

CW recognised that Transporters would have to liase with Ofgem to insert a suitable date within the suggested text in paragraph 3.7.4

The Workgroup concluded the report and agreed it should be submitted to the August UNC Panel meeting.
