The Workgroup Report is due to be presented at the UNC Modification Panel by 18 August 2016.

1.0 Outline of Modification

CB introduced the modification and explained the background in relation to the implementation of Modification 0440 - Project Nexus – iGT Single Service Provision CSEP Supply Meter Points that will introduce iGT Supply Points into the Single Service Arrangements for Gas Transporters. However, Modification 0440 excludes iGT Supply Points from use in the available sample sites, which are used for the development of the Demand Models and End User Categories by DESC.

CB further explained that this Modification proposes to allow the use of CSEP Supply Meter Points in NDM Sampling to improve the overall sample selections by ensuring that Demand Models and End User Categories are developed with a fully representative set of supply points and will permit the inclusion of CSEP Supply Meter Points in the available sites selected for NDM Sampling.

CB said the amended modification focused on the area of not requiring large Transporters to install meter reading equipment and that data could be provided by the Shipper if

available. FM said in relation to the area of the provision of data from iGT's sites was proving a little challenging from a Legal Text perspective, specifically for Section H. A lengthy general discussion took place in relation to point 1.6.1 of Section H and it was agreed that SBI, CB and FM would discuss the appropriate wording off line to resolve this matter. JF felt the legal text was sufficient in its current form as it advises that Shippers can provide data and that there is no obligation on larger Transporters to fit remote meter reading equipment on iGT sites.
