## Mod 0281, Introduction of an Implementation Timeframe for Modification Proposals

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## **Proposed Changes**

- Currently (UNC Mod Rules 6.2.1 (j));
  - [A Mod Proposal] may state the Proposer's view of possible implementation timescales for the Modification Proposal
- Proposal is that;
  - [A Mod Proposal] may state the Proposer's view of possible implementation timescales for the Modification Proposal in the following format;
    - At least two proposed 'Fixed' implementation dates,
    - A proposed 'Flexible' backstop implementation lead time,
    - Requirement to provide justification in support of the above dates, and
    - Ability to continue to leave the date "blank" if an implementation date is not critical and/or it is not practical to do so



## **Example**

- Suggested 'Fixed' Implementation dates of;
  - Decide by Date of 25/05/2010 for proposed fixed implementation of 25/06/2010
  - Decide by Date of 5/10/2010 for proposed fixed implementation of 5/11/2010
- A proposed 'Flexible' backstop implementation lead time of;
  - Six (6) calendar months after an Authority Decision being published
- Together with justification of the dates, e.g.;
  - ROM suggests that implementation of the Modification may be implemented during one of the next two UK Link\* release dates for £100k so long as a lead time of at least 1 month is allowed for
  - Alternatively if implementation during a UK Link release is not possible (i.e. the timing of the Authority decision does not provide the necessary lead time to implement with a UK Link release) then implementation can take place approximately 6 calendar months after the Authority decision is published for £150k



## **Benefits**

- Greater visibility of time related benefits and constraints of a mod
- Compliments User Pays process
  - implementation dates being considered after the Authority decision may not suit User Pays proposals where there may be benefits from a specific/early implementation date
- Better alignment of the way implementation dates are considered between electricity & gas codes
- Supports recommendations within Ofgem Code Governance Final Proposals and principles of the Code Administrator Code of Practice;
  - Allow the development of implementation dates (or options) during workgroup assessment to ensure the related benefits are captured in the proposal
  - Allow industry participants to comment on such implementation dates via the Consultation Phase
  - Ensure implementation occurs as timely as possible to capture maximum benefits
  - Eliminate risk of "Timing Out" of Authority decisions
