Request for urgent status for modification proposal UNC122: '*Restriction of invoice billing period to Price Control*'

Following consideration of the request that modification proposal 122:'*Restriction of invoice billing period to Price Control*' follows urgent modification procedures, we have today agreed to that request.

In reaching our decision on granting urgent status we have considered the details of the modification proposal and the Proposer's justification for urgency. Ofgem considers that this proposal satisfies the criteria for granting urgent status to a modification proposal, as set out in its published guidelines.¹ In particular we consider that the proposal is linked to both:

- A specific date related event; being the earliest date that an invoice can be issued to include a reconciliation of the significant South East Local Distribution Zone metering error, recently notified to the industry; and,
- A real likelihood of significant commercial impact upon GTs, shippers or consumers if the proposal is not granted urgency.

Urgency Timetable

The granting of urgent status and adherence to the timetable set out below would ensure that the proposal can be decided upon and if appropriate, implemented at the earliest opportunity.
