91.5 **Consider New, Non-Urgent Modification Proposals**

Modification Proposal 0282 - Introduction of a process to manage Long Term Vacant sites

Following a presentation by K Kennedy (Scottish Power), the Panel voted UNANIMOUSLY for this Proposal to be referred to the Distribution Workstream for consideration and development. The Distribution Workstream was requested to report by the 19 August 2010 Panel meeting.

During the presentation K Kennedy explained why the Modification Proposal had been raised. C Warner sought clarification if all supply points were included, and K Kennedy confirmed the intention to exclude Daily Metered sites. A Hall asked if there is a trigger to identify when gas consumption is resumed - will safeguards be in place to ensure accurate allocation in these circumstances. K Kennedy acknowledged this is an aspect that needed further development, including how to establish accurate AQs.

J Martin asked about safety related obligations. Shippers should isolate and withdraw to ensure obligations for gas safety cutoffs are undertaken where necessary, and J Martin asked if Scottish Power had contacted the HSE for their views on the Proposal. K Kennedy felt this was an aspects that should be followed-up as part of the development of the Proposal.

The Distribution Workstream was asked to develop Terms of Reference including the following items:

- a) Safety implications of the Proposal;
- b) Impacts on Gas Safety Regulations and Supplier obligations for the disconnection of service pipes not using gas;
- c) Impacts on unregistered gas volumes;
- d) How sites will be monitored to ensure status changes are identified.

Review Proposal 0280 - Review of Demand Estimation UNC Section H Processes and Responsibilities

The Panel UNANIMOUSLY approved the Terms of Reference for this Review Group.

91.11 <u>Receive report on status of Consents</u>

The following consents are with Ofgem for approval:

- a) C020 Changes to Document References Contained Within the UNC

- c) C033 Removal of a Redundant Cross Reference & Clarification of TPD Section K

- f) C036 Correction to the Calculation and application of VWAPEC

T Davis indicted that Ofgem had requested the Panel consider whether or not it was appropriate for C036 to be progressed as a consent. This involves a correction to the units specified in the UNC, removing divide by 100 from an equation. This would correct an error and make the legal text match the intention of the Proposal. This could therefore be regarded as correcting a manifest error, but could also be regarded as material. Panel Members confirmed that they considered the consent process was appropriate in the circumstances.

S Trivella welcomed the Panel being asked for a view on consent C036 and suggested that all consents might usefully be considered by the Panel prior to any Ofgem direction. It was agreed that, unless time was of the essence, this should be adopted for future consents.

T Davis advised that he had been offered periodic updates from Ofgem about progress and developments regarding the EU 3rd package to the extent that might impact the UNC change process. Panel Members welcomed this and agreed that Ofgem should be invited to provide an initial presentation at the earliest opportunity.
