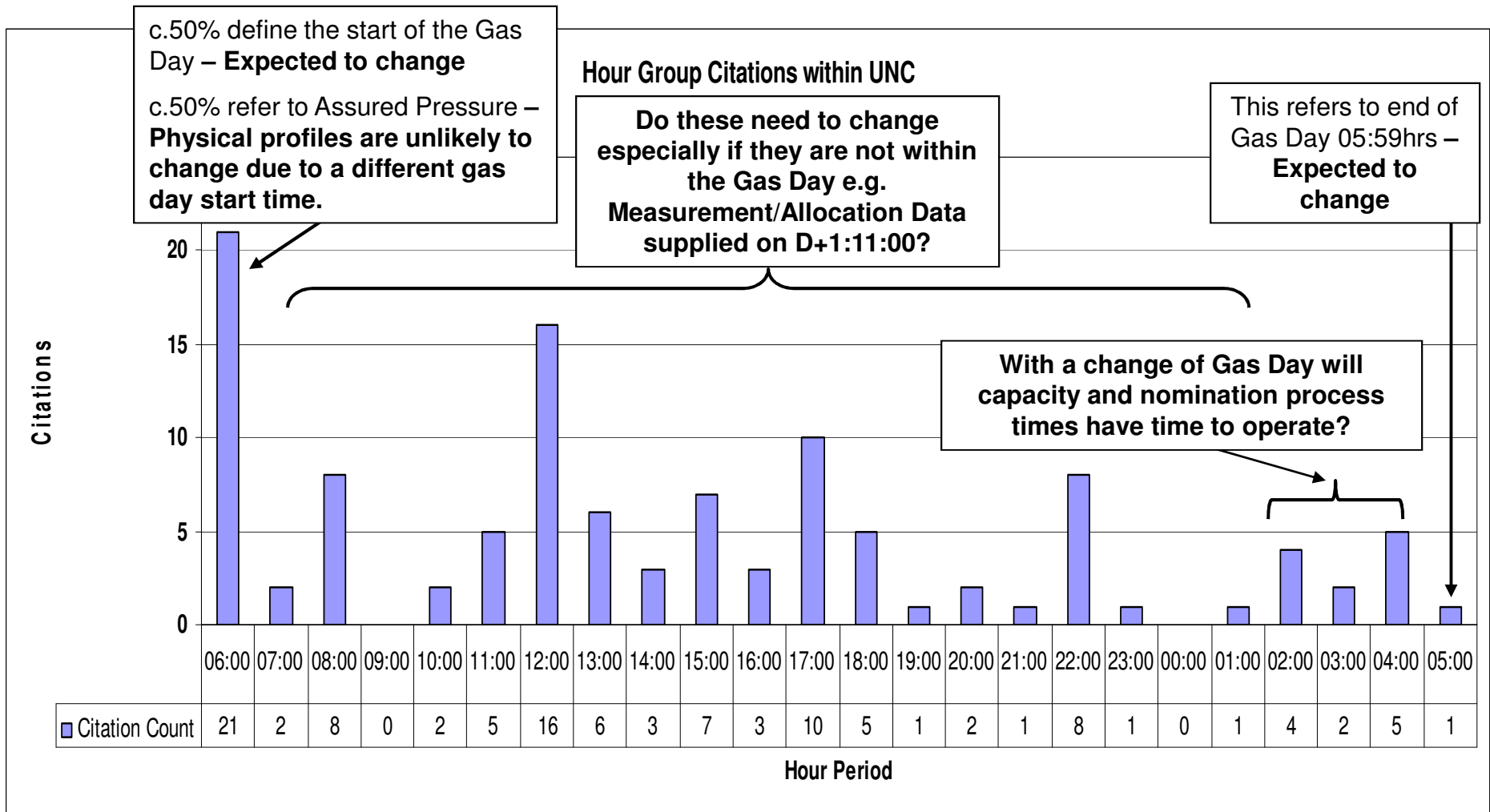

## Changing the Gas Day – Current Status

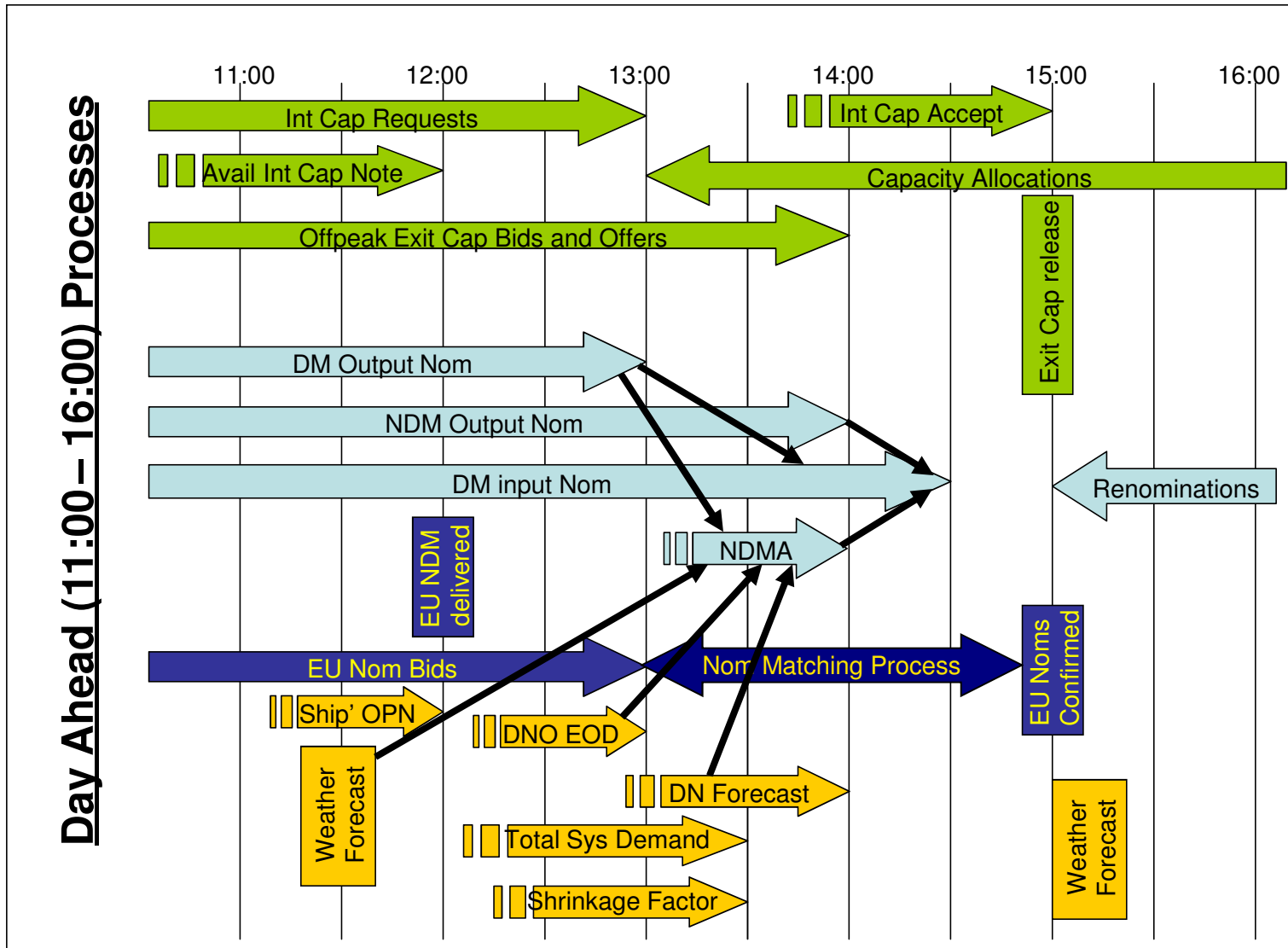
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- National Grid NTS initiated an internal review of the proposed change to the Gas Day from 06:00-06:00 to 05:00-05:00
- Initial Scope:
  - UNC and supplementary documentation
- Phase 1:
  - Search of UNC for lines with specific timings
  - Review of each specific timing to establish if it is impacted – timing may need to change
- Phase 2: to analyse the implications of making the required changes

## In Conclusion

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### ■ Summary:

- Our initial high level analysis shows that the Gas Day change will require a co-ordinated industry review as there is a high level of complexity.

### ■ Next Steps:

- **Ofgem's open letter on CMP of 12<sup>th</sup> March** invites *“views from industry participants and stakeholders on how the change to the gas day could impact the GB gas system”* **to be provided by 29<sup>th</sup> April.**
- NG NTS will be preparing a response to Ofgem and will be continuing with phase 2 of our impact analysis on processes and IT systems.
- We encourage industry participants to respond to Ofgem by the deadline of **29<sup>th</sup> April.**
- Await Ofgem's feedback on the responses.
