## 0470 - Notification of Minimal Safety operating gas needs of large customers

Please summarise (in one paragraph) the key reason(s) for your support/opposition.

HSE supports the general principle of this MOD. However, HSE is unable to support its implementation until the Network Emergency Co-ordinator (NEC) is able to confirm it is able to maintain its continued compliance with its GSMR safety case in terms of co-ordinating actions and minimising safety consequences in a Network Gas Supply Emergency (NGSE) should such an event occur. This is where a NGSE event leads to a Local Gas Supply Emergency (LGSE) event. In addition, it is still unclear whether Gas Transporters (GTs) will be able to comply fully with their GSMR safety cases to co-operate with the NEC during a supply emergency and to direct sites to cease taking gas if there is ambiguity over the level of protection the MOD affords to sites.

Modification Panel Members have indicated that it would be particularly helpful if the following questions could be addressed in responses:

Q1: Do you consider that this change will have a material impact on either your business or competition in shipping, transportation or supply of gas, and if so, what?

As the health and safety regulator for the Gas Safety (Management) Regulations 1996 there is impact on the safety cases of the NEC and GT as accepted by HSE: if the MOD is implemented the NEC & GTs may not be able to comply with their safety cases.

Are there any new or additional issues that you believe should be recorded in the Modification Report?

An NGSE event can lead to an LGSE event, so there is potential for a lack of clarity on the direction for cessation of gas to sites because in such circumstances the proposed MOD would not apply
