Please summarise (in one paragraph) the key reason(s) for your support/opposition.

Within the Proposal part 13 of the temporary interruptible process indicates "this modification excludes connections made onto the NTS and is not aimed at emergency interruption resulting from supply or system constraints on the NTS". Although we note that NTS Supply Points are out of scope of the proposal we have spoken to the proposer in order to understand how these Temporary Interruptible Supply Points will be treated with regards to a Network Gas Supply (Gas Deficit) Emergency (GDE). Scotia Gas Networks have confirmed that no changes have been proposed to Section Q of the UNC and that these Temporary Interruptible Supply Points would therefore be treated no differently to other Interruptible Supply Points and therefore included in stage 1 of a GDE should such a situation occur. We welcome this clarification and on this basis offer support to this modification, as we agree that having a temporary interruptible supply will remove barriers and delays that may otherwise prevent new supplies being connected.
