npower wishes to see a fairer allocation of unidentified gas between the SSP and LSP sectors. The legal text or UNC Modification 0229 stated that cost identified by the AUGE would be reallocated from April 2011 as specified within the original legal text. npower therefore cannot support a proposal that does not follow this but seeks to further push back the calculated expert view of unidentified gas. The current situation of cross subsidy between the LSP and SSP market is inequitable and measures to address this need to be brought in as soon as possible. Npower does not believe that the retrospective nature of this unfairly disadvantages the LSP market and in fact socialises the risk of unidentified gas that SSP Shippers deal with on a regular basis.
