Do you support or oppose implementation?

Support

Please summarise (in one paragraph) the key reason(s) for your support/opposition.

Allowing incorrect data to be retrospectively amended will produce a more accurate allocation of energy and costs amongst shippers by the reconciliation close out date and will make data more accurate going forward allowing energy to be more accurately settled. With the rollout of smart meters the amount of data will increase significantly and also the ways it will be used will change. Any error on a single data item that affects a large number of meters could result in very large misallocations in settlements. This modification will provide an 'insurance policy' against this event by allowing correction of such a situation to be undertaken much more quickly and easily. Without this functionality a data correction of this nature could take significant time and lead to parties incurring incorrect costs on large amounts of misallocated energy.

It is sensible to bring in this modification at the same time as modification 432 and to build this functionality into a brand new system rather than try to retrofit it at a later date which would result in significantly higher costs and a longer development time.
