Extending the time in which Shippers can submit an actual opening meter reading will increase the accuracy of data being entered in settlement which will promote a more accurate allocation of costs between Shippers. This will help secure effective competition between relevant Shippers and Suppliers better facilitating Relevant Objective (d).
