Please summarise (in one paragraph) the key reason(s) for your support/opposition.

The move to 95%/5% Capacity/Commodity split of Transportation System Charges was implemented in October 2008 following a consultation with interested parties - Consultation document DNPC03 refers. The analysis clearly showed that the majority of costs relate to our asset base which we would incur regardless of movements in throughput and were therefore more aligned to a Capacity charge. The Commodity charge reflects costs which vary with throughput and from the detailed analysis done under DNPC03 the level of costs which varied with throughput represented only 5% of total System costs.

Under the transporter licence the GDNs have an obligation to ensure that transportation charges are cost reflective and so by making the change to 95%/5% Capacity/Commodity the GDNs were ensuring that they complied with the Licence requirements.

We do not believe that the proposer or the Workgroup have identified any reasons, or provided any justification, for effectively reversing the decision taken following significant industry review back in 2008. We therefore cannot support the implementation of this modification proposal.

We have not identified any new issues.
