This proposal allows new (large) sites to connect to the Gas Distribution Network using a temporary (zero cost) interruptible contact, in the lead time until its connection is firm. This measure promotes a better use of any spare capacity until such time as any necessary reinforcement is complete to satisfy peak demand on the Network. This 'earlier' connection will also assist those shippers/suppliers/end customers by facilitating an earlier connection than would otherwise be the case.
