Why change?

- Responsibility for mastering registration data will transfer from the UNC to the Retail Energy Code (REC) following the implementation of the Central Switching Service (CSS).
- In order to ensure the effective implementation of the CSS and the consequential changes to the UK Link systems certain responsibilities will need to be discontinued in the UNC in advance of the CSS Implementation or suspended for a period in line with the transitional rules defined within the Ofgem Faster Switching Programme.

Options

- This Modification will set out the necessary transitional rules. e.g. the last date that a Confirmation can be sent to the CDSP for it to become effective under the UNC.
- This may require the definition of Non Effective Days. This will be defined by the Ofgem Faster Switching Programme approach – e.g. if this is a non Monday implementation.



• The Modification will define a set of deadlines for Code Communications (such as Nominations, Confirmations and Supply Point Amendments) to be issued to [and from] the CDSP to be effective prior to CSS Go Live.

Recommended Steps

• The Proposer recommends that this modification should be: Subject to self-governance

 Workgroup assessment to develop the modification for 3 months (i.e. to conclude at the December 2021 Workgroup)
