

Performance Assurance Committee Meeting

Summary – 16th August 2022

KEY MESSAGES

AREAS OF PAC CONCERN

UNC674V (Performance Assurance Techniques and Controls) implementation; The PAC discussed the Ofgem decision which has designated 1st November 2022 for the implementation of UNC674V. The discussion included how the new Performance Assurance Framework Document (PAFD) should be implemented. The PAC noted that the development of the Holistic Performance Matrix will aid them in their decision making around applying new Performance Assurance Techniques (PATs) on Performance Assurance Parties (PAPs), although acknowledged that there is a six-week transition period written into the modification which would mean the PAC could not apply PATS to new engagements. The Holistic Performance Matrix will be brought back to the September PAC meeting for sign off.

• SHIPPER PERFORMANCE ANALYSIS

 The Performance Assurance Framework Administrator (PAFA) provided the Performance Assurance Committee (PAC) with updates on four of the five Shippers (excluding those which are part of the PC4 monthly improvement targeting activity) that are currently on Performance Improvement Plans. With one Shipper successfully closing their Performance Improvement Plan.
