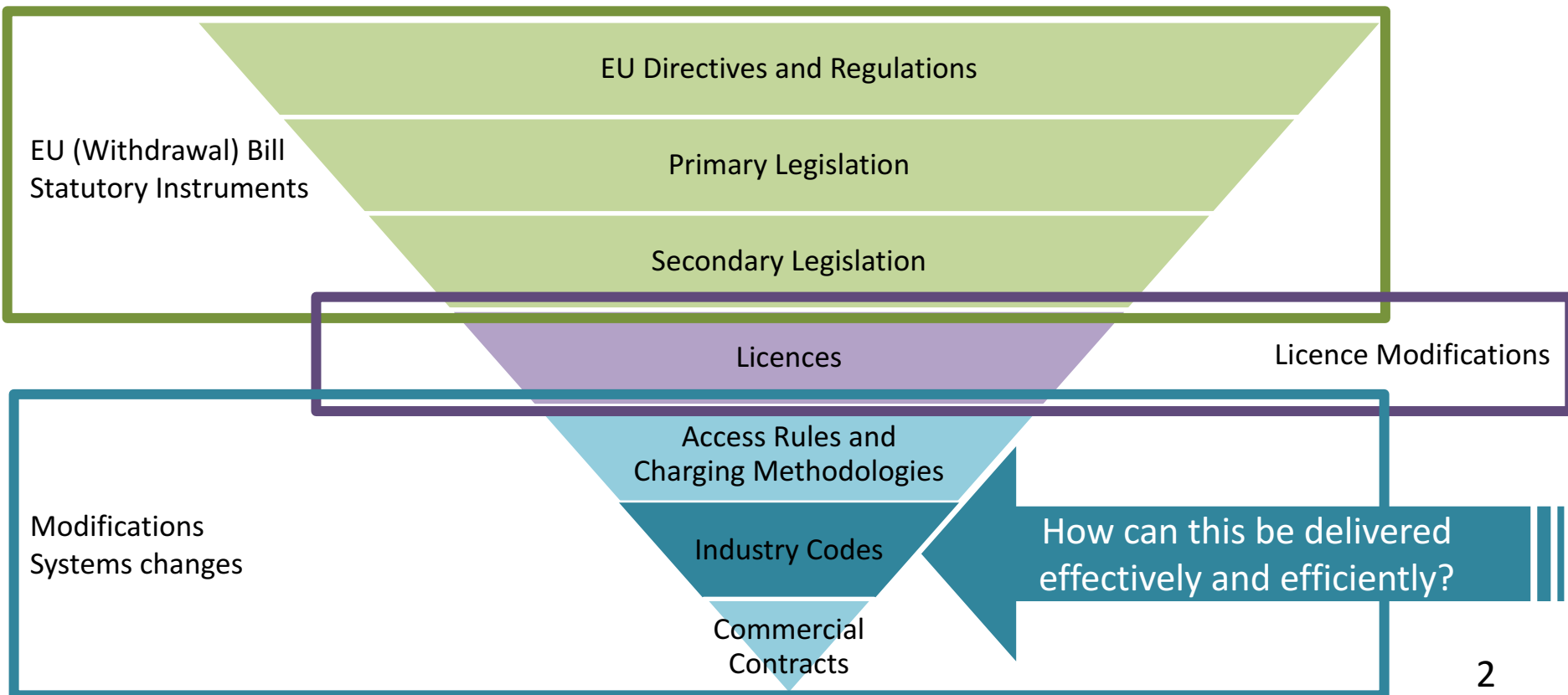

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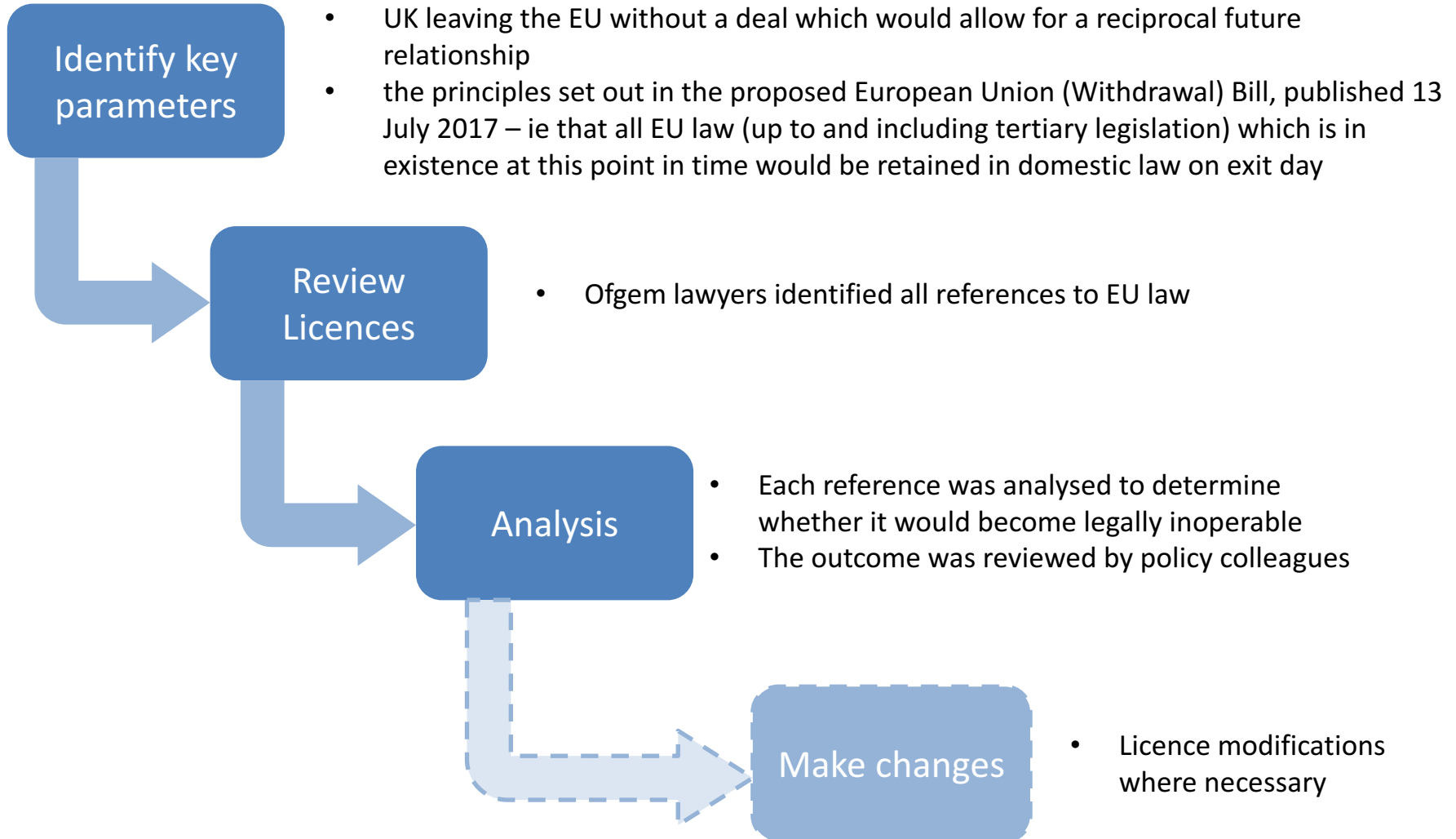
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We all have a shared interest in ensuring that the regulatory framework is fit for purpose on 29 March 2019

To do this we need to identify areas that may need amending to work, regardless of the negotiations

If we all do our roles we can manage the process effectively





Trawl of codes completed by end of September

Analysis of options for remedying key issues completed by end of October

Pre-mod process on remedies, October to April

Our current expectation is that the formal modification process will need to begin in April

Implementation of the modifications in March 2019

Flexibility is key throughout this whole process.
As greater clarity arises the process must evolve to meet any identified needs, always ensuring that the implementation date is met.
